

BREAKOUT

What is a breakout session? A breakout is a fun introduction to Cub Scouts for the boys and their siblings while the adult leaders are recruited and registration paper work is completed. Remember, the point is to have fun and show a lot of enthusiasm for Cub Scouting.

The best way to decide what to do with your Cub Scouts while their parents are filling out their paper work is to determine how many boys (don't forget siblings might also be included) you will be supervising, and how many adult helpers you have available. This is the one night of the year to get every parent, teacher, charter partner member, friend or relative involved. Don't forget to enlist the aid of Scouts from the troops in your district. The success of your recruiting depends on how much information you can give the parents and how at ease they feel during the meeting. Don't hesitate to place your volunteers where they are needed.

Choose a simple activity for your breakout group. Remember: Keep It Simple, Make It Fun! Consider splitting the large group into smaller groups for a variety of activities. If you have enough helpers, divide the boys by rank with one or more adult per rank. The ultimate plan is to have one adult per rank, one adult per activity station, and one or two floaters. Then the "dens" can be rotated through a mini camp.
